From Toni's desk

We have celebrated another great week at Hamlyn Banks. It is wonderful to see all students participating in individual conferences with their teachers to identify new learning goals and to discuss strategies to achieve success in these goals. This information will support discussions at our upcoming Parent Teacher Interviews.

Parent Teacher Interviews

This semester's Parent Teacher Interviews will be conducted over the next two weeks (Tuesday February 21 and Tuesday February 28), from 3.30-6.00pm. Each interview will be scheduled for a duration of 10 minutes. We encourage all parents to log onto Compass to secure an appointment time for this important transfer of information. If you are unable to attend an interview on either of these days, we encourage you to contact either your child's teacher or the office to make an alternate meeting time.

Prep parents please note that you have already undertaken Parent Teacher interviews earlier this term, so unless you have a particular issue to discuss with your child's teacher, you do not need to make an appointment time.

Fees

Our school fees are set at \$185 for the 2017 school year. This price is extremely reasonable in comparison to other school/kindergarten fees. For us to ensure a high quality education for your child, it is extremely important that these fees are paid by all families.

CSEF

Any parent with a Health Care Card or Pension Card is able to claim a \$125 subsidy, which can be used for camps, sports or excursions. Forms are available at the office to be completed for the 2017 school year.

State School Relief, as part of the Victorian Government's funding for school uniforms, will provide every <u>eligible</u> Prep student with a Hamlyn Banks hoodie. This will process will begin in term 2.

2017 School Council

The 2017 School Council process will run over the next few weeks. The Hamlyn Banks School Council consists of 14 members, with 9 parent and 5 staff representatives. We meet on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 6.00pm, and these forums provide an opportunity for parents to have input into the operation of the school. For the 2017 elections there will be 6 parent vacancies and 1 staff vacancy.

We are very mindful of the dangerous effects that sun exposure can have on our skin. *All students are expected to wear a wide brimmed hat* for all outdoor activity, which includes recess/lunch breaks, PE classes and Assembly. We have very clear processes in regard to our 'no hat' expectations at Hamlyn Banks. If students do not have a hat, they are required to play only in one of two allocated shade areas during breaks. There is signage to indicate the 'no hat zones' and teachers will be redirecting any student without a hat to these areas.

We do have a small number of hats for sale at the office at a cost of \$15.00 for a Hamlyn Banks bucket hat or \$8.00 for plain navy blue wide brimmed hats. Your child can be fitted at the office to ensure correct sizing.

Congratulations to the 10 classes whose students all have a hat. We are very proud of you!

Hi Everyone,


