Semester 1 Reports

Congratulations to all students on receiving their Semester One report. This report compliments the ongoing academic information that has been provided to parents and carers throughout Semester One via Compass. Upcoming weeks will see students revisit their learning goals to either review strategies to achieve these, or create new learning goals. I would like to congratulate all students for their positive gains in regard to attendance, engagement and learning.

3 Way Conferences

Extensive research tells us that students *owning* their data has an extremely positive impact on learning growth. This involves students setting learning goals and tracking their learning progress in an ongoing manner. At Hamlyn Banks, individual learning goals are a major component of our daily practice.

To further this notion of student driven practice, our upcoming Parent/Teacher Interviews will have a slightly different format, where all students will engage in a 3 Way Conference. 3 Way Conferences are a discussion between the teacher, parent and student. In this format, students articulate their learning goals and progress to their parents/carers, and share samples of work that are most relevant to them. As a parent, what can I expect from a 3 Way Conference?

- Come in with an open mindset ... this is my child sharing their learning
- Be ready to ask questions
- Respect your child as a learner and understand their learning expertise
- Understand that your child may share their current learning goals, pieces of work that resonate with them, their next learning goals, special achievements from Semester One, challenges from Semester One
- Hear possible recommendations as to what support your child may require in order to succeed in Semester Two.

Conferences will be 15 minutes in duration. Ten minutes of this time will be committed to students sharing their learning, and the last 5 minutes will offer the opportunity for the teacher and parent to discuss any other items. As the main feature of this forum is for students to articulate their learning we do ask that where possible, younger siblings have alternate care during the Conference. This will allow your child an uninterrupted opportunity to share their valuable learning experiences.

Though there are **no classes for students on Monday July 31**, your child is expected to accompany you to the Conference meeting. Conferences will commence at 11.00am, and the last conference time available will be 6.45pm (students in Mrs Hickleton's class will be undertaking their

Bookings can be made through Compass and should you require support with this process, please contact our office staff. Your child will be creating a personalised invitation which encourages you to be a part of this very important forum. We look forward to seeing you there!
